Home to Australia's most accessible World Heritage-listed rainforests, the Scenic Rim encapsulates all that's appealing about a rural escape. Think country pubs, charming characters and lots of clean fresh air.

DAY ONE - MOUNT TAMBORINE

Meander on up to Mount Tamborine and spoil yourself to a fresh coffee and homestyle morning tea from one of the charming cafés.

Take a stroll down Gallery Walk and fossick about for antiques and art in the local country lanes. Tour the local wineries and stock up on gourmet supplies at the Witches Chase Cheese Company, Mount Tamborine Brewery and Tamborine Mountain Distillery before bunkering down in a cosy bed and breakfast for the night.



DAY TWO - MOUNT TAMBORINE

Hitch a ride down the mountain with a local hang-glider or simply enjoy the spectacle as the brave-hearted take to the skies.

Explore the fantastic rainforest scenery on the National Park walking tracks or at the Tamborine Rainforest Skywalk.

Tackle the challenge of an aerial acrobatics course at the Mount Tamborine Adventure Park.

DAY THREE - MOUNT BARNEY

Journey to Mount Barney and take in the bushwalking and rock climbing highlights of its World Heritage-listed National Park.

Hop on horseback and join a trail ride through the dramatic scenery or get gourmet with an Italian cooking class, olive grove tour or vineyard wine tasting.

Relax overnight at the foot of Mount Barney in one of Queensland's oldest farmstays - Lillydale.



DAY FOUR - BOONAH

Enjoy the scenic drive to nearby Boonah and spend the morning ambling along the main street, browsing through the independent art galleries.

Stop off for a hearty country lunch, a cold beer and a chat with the locals in a local pub laced with history and tall tales.

Soar through the skies and get an eagle eye view of the region's stunning patchwork fields with the Boonah Gliding Club.

DAY FIVE - GRANDCHESTER

Continue the Scenic Rim adventure with a leisurely drive to the 12,000 acre working cattle station of Spicers Hidden Vale.

Get active with any number of activities on offer - from mountain biking to bushwalking to horseriding.

Settle in for the night with a 5-star bushtucker feast and a starlit campfire experience.
